Through our work in schools across the country DRIVE has found that it is difficult to create an effective and highly functioning school if the individual members do not have a genuine sense of community. This overall feeling of belonging is essential for all of us as human beings, but it is critical for children during their developmental years. When students are transitioning into the middle grades or high school they often come from segmented populations and intentional programming is needed to unite students together into one community.



Last August, I was privileged to be part of DRIVE's 6th grade orientation. The DRIVE Team empowered our students to establish words they felt were important regarding how others should be treated. They used these words, with the guidance of their teachers, to come up with a covenant they all agreed to and signed. This has been beneficial for teachers, students, and parents as they are able to refer to the covenant and ensure the students are being who they have agreed to be. Additionally, students became familiar with the "basic needs" that daily motivate each human being.


